




BUNDABERG







Directed by Rebecca Hutchins

This six-character comedy is a spoof of and love letter to screwball comedies and to stage mysteries in general, featuring witty dialogue and laugh-out-loud slapstick comedy. The play opens with the rich, bored Matthew promising to kill his rich, bored wife Julia so he can become a jet setter like his friend who recently lost his wife. Julia, who's always about three steps ahead of him, plays along ... And so, the game of cat and mouse begins - a hilarious year-long match of wits and the witless.



'A Little Murder Didn't Hurt Anybody'

The Perry's have it all --- money, friends, and status in the community --- but their marriage seems to have landed in a rut. As the show opens, the Perrys make their traditional New Years resolutions together: Matthew declares to Julia that he wants something more... to be able to travel abroad. to play golf every day, to spend more time at his club. Thus, he resolves to kill her by next New Years Eve so he will be free to pursue his heart's desires. Julia takes his resolution in stride and resolves to still be alive a year later. Their games begin and they let no one stand in their ways as they attempt to keep their resolutions as the year goes by. To liven things up, we add the Perry's spoiled, dingy daughter Bunny, her bright and forgiving boyfriend Donald and their plans for their wedding on the following New Year's Eve. We also must deal with Buttram, the Perry's longtime butler who harbors a dreadful secret - or two. Entering the fray is a bumbling police detective named Plotnik who tries to figure out "who-done-it" --- that is if something really has been done. Who will succeed in his or her resolution --- and who gets caught in the crossfire? This hilarious comedy has lots of surprises, right up to the end.

A Little Murder Never Hurt Anybody was first performed in 1991 by Grosse Pointe Theatre, Michigan's premiere community theatre. It won the 1991 Community Association of Michigan New Plays competition and has since become a staple on the community theatre circuit.

About the Playwright:

Ron Bernas is a longtime Detroit-area communications specialist. He spent more than 20 years in journalism, working at weekly and daily newspapers. He is also a playwright whose award-winning murder mystery comedy A Little Murder Never Hurt Anybody been performed around the world.

Buttram played by Paul Burrell


